





ABOUT THE ARTIST: Diane Belfiglio was an incredible artist who, like the title in this work, transfixed many of us in wonder by her talent. She was a presence in the art community as a teacher, patron, and supporter of all involved: students, other artists, galleries, and the community. Her presence and generosity have been greatly missed, but will not be forgotten. The Little Art Gallery holds two oil pastel drawings created by Belfiglio, Transfixed by Tulips I, purchased in 2023, and Digression Into Detail IV, purchased in 2021.

Belfiglio works are included in the permanent collections of six museums, including the Butler Institute of Art in Youngstown, Ohio, the Itchiku Kubota Art Museum in Tokyo, Japan, and the Canton Museum of Art. In addition, her works are in 16 corporate, hospital, and university art collections, as well as numerous private collections, including that of singer Patti LaBelle. Her painting, Trumpeter of Justice, was selected for the permanent collection of the Stark County Courthouse. Her work was displayed at the Ohio Governor's Office for 11 years through a juried program sponsored by the Ohio Arts Council. In 2018, she was the Featured Spotlight Artist at the Governor's Residence, selected by the Office of the First Lady of Ohio. In 2023, she was the recipient of the Award of Excellence from the Ohio Arts Council.

The four-page spread showcases the artist and artwork, with the step-by-step process of creating the Blue Heron.

ABOUT THE ARTIST: Pat Mather Waltz lives on a small farm in East Canton. She and her husband have one daughter, son in-law, three grandchildren, two dogs, and two horses. Most of Waltz's art is inspired by nature, especially animals; often endangered or extinct ones. She enjoys drawing, sculpting, and embroidering horses and dogs. Pat graduated from Glenwood High School in 1963, Malone (College) University in 1983, with a double major in Visual Art and English, and has a graduate study at Walsh University and Ashland University. She has worked as a floral designer, mapping draftsman, graphic designer, sign painter and substitute teacher. Waltz is a member of Friends of the Little Art Gallery, the Canton Artists League, and for fourteen years was a member of the Canton Chapter of Embroiderers Guild of America.

Waltz held an exhibit in the Little Art Gallery in 2023 with another local artist, Marjorie Lutes, titled "Calculated Curiosities". She is also currently teaching beginning clay sculpting classes at the North Canton Public Library.



a passport to explore the world

Your library card gives you access to a world of information at NCPL. Use it at the library during open hours. Use it on our website or app after hours. Our world is always available in one form or another.

GET A CARD

- 1. Complete our brief application online.
- 2. Bring a Driver's License or State I.D. with your current address to the Patron Services Desk at the library. If you don't have your current address on your I.D., you will need to bring a form with your name and new address on it, such as a utility bill, insurance notification or lease agreement.
- 3. Your card will be ready in minutes and you may check items out the same day.

TEACHERS

Teacher library cards allow up to 100 children's books to be checked out at any time for weeks with one two-week renewal available. Teacher privileges apply only to children's for classroom use. Other library materials including audiobooks, music CDs, kits, electron devices, and DVDs must be checked out using a general patron library card. As with all morary cards, overdue items will be charged a late fee and full price will be charged for lost or damaged items. We strive to assist North Canton Public Schools' educators and homeschoolers. Visit the Children's Department for information on the many special services we offer.

GOLDEN BUCKEYE CARD HOLDERS

Patrons of any age who have a Golden Buckeye Card qualify for fine free status. Simply show us your card one time, and we will change the status of your account to be fine free. Golden Buckeye Card holders continue to receive notices about late items and will still be charged replacement costs if materials are lost or damaged.
