Dear North Canton Community,

Each holiday season brings with it a host of family traditions that elicit joy, make us grit our teeth, or cause us to feel a little nostalgic. (Sometimes all three.) Neal and Del become unlikely travel companions when their flight from New York to Chicago is diverted two days before Thanksgiving, forcing them to find alternative methods of travel in hopes of making it home in time for the holiday.

Of course, hilarity ensues, mostly because Neal and Del are diametric opposites. Neal is an introvert who loathes small talk with strangers while Del is hungry for a connection with his new traveling companion. Neal is a tidy character while Del is literally a bumbling mess. Neal is easily irritated while Del is continually seeking the bright side. The chemistry between the two actors is palpable and part of what makes this movie special.

Perhaps most important, though, is the powerful gift of compassion that comes as a result of the twist at the end of the movie. (Don't worry, I won't spoil it!) Two very different men make a meaningful, lasting connection by the time the credits roll. They appreciate each other for who they are and what they represent. Each one is able to stand in the other man's shoes for a moment to consider his companion's perspective.

It makes all the difference.

In fact, it's what leads them home.

As we look forward to a new year in 2025, I encourage you to consider Neal and Del in *Planes, Trains and Automobiles*. You'll encounter friends, family, and strangers in the year ahead, all of whom are in different places in their lives – all of whom are on their own journeys, some of which we know nothing about.

Compassion could be the greatest gift you give them this year. Like Neal and Del, we are all travelers on this road together.







Your library card gives you access to a world of information at NCPL. Use it at the library during open hours. Use it on our website after hours. Our world is always available in one form or another.

GET A CARD

- 1. Complete our brief application online.
- 2. Bring a driver's license or state I.D. with your current address to the Patron Services Desk at the library. If you don't have your current address on your I.D., you will need to bring a form with your name and new address on it, such as a utility bill, insurance notification or lease agreement.
- 3. Your card will be ready in minutes, and you may check items out the same day.

TEACHERS

Teacher library cards allow up to 100 children's books to be checked out at any time for six weeks with one two-week renewal available. Teacher privileges apply only to children's books for classroom use. Other library materials including audiobooks, music CDs, kits, electronic devices and DVDs must be checked out using a general patron library card.
